Curriculum Overview Year 3/4 Autumn 2

What is the greatest Empire the world has ever known?

English

We will study and read the book:

We will build on our knowledge of adjectives and expanded noun phrases when describing characters and settings from the story. We will also develop our understanding of fronted adverbials, inverted commas, when writing our stories. Other areas we will work on will include:

Science, History, Geography, Art, D&T and ICT

During this half term in Science, we will be learning about Animals including Humans. This unit focuses on the digestive system in humans and animals and the functions of teeth. Children will learn more about herbivores, carnivores and omnivores in the context of teeth, digestion and the food chain. In addition, they will extend their understanding of food chains to more complex chains and food webs. In History the children will learn about the Roman Empire and its impact on Britain, including: - Julius Caesar's attempted invasion in 55-54 BC - The Roman Empire by AD 42 and the power of its army - Successful invasion by Claudius and conquest, including Hadrian's Wall - British resistance, for example, Boudicca - 'Romanisation' of Britain: sites such as Caerwent and the impact of technology, culture and beliefs, including early Christianity. Geography To learn about Continents and countries of the world including which ones the Romans invaded. Art/DT Children will research and designs, Roman Togas, mosaics and make Roman artefacts.

Mathematics

In Maths, we will be developing our understanding of multiplication and division. This will include:

- Problem Solving using multiplication
- Problem Solving using division
- Inverse operations
- Roman Numerals/Representing Number
- Mental tímes tables
- Written method Multiplication
