EARLY YEARS

Nursery

This week, Nursery children had the exciting task of learning all about China . We have learnt many fascinating things such as how to say "hello" in Mandarin, how to dance like the dragons and lions in our PE lesson as well as special holidays that are celebrated in China. Teaching children about their culture and the culture of others instills values, traditions and customs that are important to their community. This



supports a sense of belonging amongst the children as well as cultural appreciation which has been felt throughout nursery this week with children sharing their own experiences of culture and heritage.

Reception

This week in Reception, we have been learning about France and Ireland. We have had lots of fun learning about the coun-

tries and completing many creative activities such as making leprechaun masks, passports, flags and Eiffel towers using straws. We have stepped through Celtic rhymes and Parisian pieds as we learnt their traditional dances. We enjoyed tasting soda bread from Ireland and



foods from France which included brie, stilton, baguettes, crepes and pain au chocolat. C'est tres amusant!!

KEY STAGE 1

Year 1

Year one have been busy this week exercising their mathematical brains to count in groups of 10. They used a variety of resources to help them count forwards and backwards. The children have also thoroughly enjoyed taking part in cultural week as they learnt all about Poland and Japan.



Year 2

Year Two have loved cultural week! Purple class have enjoyed learning about Turkey. We learnt how to say 'hello' and count to 5. We also enjoyed some craft activities such as making flags, tulips and Turkish eyes.



Charlotte class have loved learning about Italy! We made collage flags, plates of spaghetti and meatballs (craft ones!) and enjoyed a presentation all about Italy shared by Francesca's mum.



LOWER KEY STAGE 2

Year 3

This week for cultural week, we have been learning about Canada and South Africa. Yellow class has been on a safari with Mr D and have totally inhabited South African culture, including learning and speaking isiZulu.



Blue class has learnt so many facts, we are truly astounded! They have been investigating Canada's First Nation and have built a Totem pole. We have so much to share with you but we have our class assemblies next half term so watch this space...



Year 4

Year 4 has been very busy. We have continued building our night lights in DT. The children have learnt about bioluminescence and used this knowledge to construct their night lights. Both classes have had their class assemblies where we showcased our learning journey so far. Miss Rogers and Mrs Jenkins are extremely proud of all the children - their performances were excellent.

We have also been taking part in the whole school cultural week. Amber were researching Thailand and Emerald were researching Spain.

UPPER KEY STAGE 2

Year 5

We have had an exciting week learning about Nigeria in Sapphire class for cultural week. We located Nigeria

class for cultural week. We located Nigeria on a map, discussed the culture and geographical features. In English, we created a set of instructions as a 'How to survive in a...' guide, with a choice of either the rainforest, desert, savannah or rivers. The children had the opportunity to taste Nigerian



foods prepared by Miss Egdell—thank you to her for arranging this. They have also created art works in the style of the Nigerian artist Jimoh Buraimoh.

In Elizabeth class, we have been learning about Romania. In English, the children wrote a detailed instruction on how to climb Moldiveanu Peak in Romania.

Year 6

In William class, we have been learning about Australia. We have created our own persuasive leaflets on why people should visit the country. We have researched the different states and looked at many

of the animals associated with Australia. In art, we created our own versions of dot art which was inspired by the aboriginal people. We also created our own versions of the Uluru using watercolours.

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This week in Charles class, we have been learning about Mexi-





co. In our English lessons, we have been creating a setting description about the Mexican Afterlife inspired by 'Coco'. In Art, we have been decorating skulls as this links to the festivities of 'Dia De Los Muertos' or 'Day of the Dead'.
