EARLY YEARS

Nursery

This week, we have been reading Sam Plants a Sunflower. It is a wonderful tale that teaches children all about patience and the joys of gardening and watching plants grow. We have been inspired by the tale to do some planting of our own. We have been busy planting petunias, pansies and even our very own sunflower seeds. Next week we will be sending the children home with their little pots to complete the germination process at home. How tall will their sunflowers grow?







Reception

We have had a fantastic week learning about meerkats after reading the story Meerkat Mail. We learnt many interesting

facts, including that they are social animals as they can live with up to 50 other meerkats in a mob! We also learnt that they are omnivores as they eat plants and animals. We used yellow playdough to make meerkats and used 3D materials to create meerkats. We had great fun



writing letters and using envelopes like the meerkat from our story.

KEY STAGE 1

Year 1

In Design and Technology this week, we designed our hand puppets following a design criteria. We then followed our plans. We used a hand puppet template for the two identical pieces of material and cut around the template. We are ready to staple and complete our hand puppets for next week's lesson.



Year 2

This week, we have become artists and created beautiful pieces of artwork based on Henri Rousseau. We had to think carefully to ensure that we had a jungle themed background with vibrant colours and animals camouflaging themselves.



LOWER KEY STAGE 2

Year 3

The children were very excited this week, as they brought their respective biomes to life and had an opportunity to share their research with year 2 children. In small groups, the year 2 children took a geographical journey visiting the various biomes and listened to the information being shared by the year 3 children.





Year 4

This week, the children have been putting the final touches on their narratives, inspired by the book Krindlekrax in English. Their challenge was to create a compelling story that included a dilemma and an unexpected twist at the end. After completing their drafts, they used the chromebooks to type up their final versions. It has been fantastic to see their creativity come to life on the page!





UPPER KEY STAGE 2

Year 5

We have continued our fascinating learning journey about Ramadan and Eid al-Fitr. In addition to our classroom learning, we've taken our maths lessons outdoors! The children have been exploring a variety of problem-solving strategies while investigating area and perimeter using practical measuring tools, such as measuring tapes and measuring wheels. They also gathered real-life data and used this information to construct line graphs. It's been a fantastic week of active, hands-on learning!







Year 6

The children have worked incredibly hard during SATs week. We looked at calculating the mean of numbers during maths earlier in the week. The children have enjoyed playing tennis and dodgeball in PE this week. We finished off our week by watching Holes (the book we have been reading in English) and going bowling as a reward for the children's hard work during this week.

EVERY SCHOOL DAY MATTERS



Penalty Notice Fines for absence from school are changing

From 19th August 2024 Penalty Notice fines increase to £160 for each parent, for each child.











You can be fined if your child has a total of 5 days of unauthorised absences in 10 school weeks, for things like:

- being late after the register has closed
- truancy
- taking a holiday without permission from the school
- or if a headteacher isn't satisfied for the reason for missing school

Over a rolling 3-year period the sanctions are:

- 1st offence £160 reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days
- 2nd offence £160
- 3rd offence Court hearing and up to £2,500 fine, or up to 3 months in prison and a criminal record
