Staffing and Recruitment

We have had a successful round of recruitment recently. We have appointed some wonderful new learning support assistants. These include Miss Maariyah Chaudhry who will be starting in Year 4 and will be supporting groups in Red and Charlotte Classes and Mrs Marina Perzefi who will be supporting groups of children in Purple Class. Mrs Deborah Trotman is also returning to the school and will be working in Silver Nursery Class. Our new staff members are extremely well qualified and the children have been really enjoying working with them.

We have also appointed an additional full time Nursery Teacher who will be based in Silver Nursery. Mrs Monica Bura originally trained for teaching in Romania but has since had experience working as a pre-school teacher in nursery schools in Pinner and Hemel Hempstead. Her appointment will provide further staffing in our nursery classes and will also release Mrs White to teach some maths and science lessons in Red Class. Furthermore, during the majority of the time when both teachers are in the nursery Mrs White will have the opportunity to further develop our forest school and outdoor early years' provision.

As a result of this new additional teaching appointment there will be some other staffing re-arranged. This means that intimate care forms will need to be completed again in early years for some children. These will be sent out by Miss Waller later today. I thank parents and carers for completing and returning these as soon as possible.

Finally, we are pleased that Mrs Henshall will be returning after her maternity leave. Mrs Henshall will be sharing responsibility for Charlotte Class with Mrs Jenkins and Miss Hendrickson. Mrs Henshall will be teaching these pupils on Mondays next half term and on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays in the summer term.

With all of these additional appointments the children are in a very fortunate position of having much higher than average amounts of support in classrooms for the remainder of the academic year.

Natural History Museum at Tring, Year 4 school trip- Tuesday, 30 January 2024



On Tuesday 30 January, Year 4 visited The Natural History Museum at Tring.

The Museum was originally the private collection of Lionel Walter Rothschild but is now controlled by the Natural History Museum in London.

The children spent the day walking and exploring the galleries and sketching some of the many stuffed mammals, birds, reptiles and insects the museum holds. The staff from the museum shared many interesting facts about the animals. They learned that the Museum holds 4000 different species of animals and insects. They had the opportunity to touch a stuffed snake, fox, and squirrel monkey.
