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## Year 2 'WOW Day'- The Great Fire of London

Year 2 had a very exciting day on Tuesday. To complete our History topic about The Great Fire of London we had a 'WOW Day'. As the fire had begun in the bakery we linked this to our food technology curriculum and we made some scones. We really enjoyed weighing the ingredients and mixing them before they were baked. Using the measuring scales and jugs supported our learning in Maths.







We also completed some craft activities, making puppets of characters from the time and some small houses. We arranged the houses to represent Pudding Lane and used the puppets to retell the events. We used quill pens to pretend to be Samuel Pepys, writing in his diary. Some of us even tried to create our own secret codes.







We had the opportunity to dress up as King Charles II, Samuel Pepys and people living in London at the time. This was a favourite activity, we laughed a lot, especially when we tried on the long curly wigs.

To finish the session, we went outside to re-enact trying to put out the Great Fire of London using buckets and fire hooks. Once we had learned about a bucket chain, we had a competition to see which team could get the buckets of 'water' from the River Thames to the burning building. Using the fallen leaves as water was really visual, added a fun element but saved us getting wet.







We had a lovely day, and it was a fitting end to a history topic that we have been so enthusiastic about. Next half term we will be learning about our capital city of London in our Geography lessons so we should be able to use the knowledge of places and landmarks that we have covered during our learning this half term.
