EARLY YEARS

Nursery

In maths we have been learning height vocabulary such as 'tall', 'taller', 'tallest' 'small', 'smaller', 'smallest' and showing how we understand this by using different resources to build

towers. The children are continuing to learn the initial sound of their name and beginning to write them. The children love music and movement; especially our stick song using claves. They are developing their listening skills and following instructions- Well done!



Reception

This week, we have been busy learning polar bear facts - did you know they have 42 teeth! They use their

large paws to swim, walk on ice and snow. They are carnivores and eat meat. Polar bears have black skin and white fur, with their blubber to help keep them warm. We had an 'I spy' activity outside counting the different characters from the story which the chil-

dren enjoyed. In maths, we have been sorting different things ensuring that the items in 1 group have something in common as each other and in the other group they are the same.

KEY STAGE 1

Year 1

The children in year 1 have been magnificent scientists this week! They carried out an experiment

to find out which materials are waterproof. We made predictions of whether the materials would be waterproof or not. In history, we explored what our older relative's toys used to be like. We discussed if toys from 60 years ago were similar or different to modern day toys!



Year 2

In science, we have been looking at how plants grow. As part

of this unit of work, we are conducting an experiment to see if a seed will germinate without sunlight. We have planted seeds in two pots, leaving one in a cupboard with no sunlight and putting one on the windowsill. We will take the latter one home and our half-term homework will be to take care of it!



LOWER KEY STAGE 2

Year 3

This week, we have been studying the unit of money in maths. The children have been converting pounds to pence, adding and subtracting and checking that they have been given the correct change. They have enjoyed the hands on experience of working with money and we have suggested helping you, the parents, with the shopping this weekend!



Year 4

This week, we have been busy turning scenes from our class

reader, Krindlekrax by Philip Ridley, into exciting playscripts. The children have been learning how to use key features of playscript writing, including stage directions, character dialogue, and guidance for actor voice and expression.

They have worked hard to bring the colourful characters of Lizard Street to life.



UPPER KEY STAGE 2

Year 5

This week, the children have been busy planning and writing recount letters based on key events from the Elizabethan era. They carefully considered how people from different backgrounds might have felt during the major changes that took place under Queen Elizabeth I's reign.

In their history lessons, the children explored the stark differences between the lifestyles of rich and poor Elizabethans. They investigated contrasts in education, healthcare, employment, and crime and punishment. The children were

fascinated by how dramatically life could vary depending on one's social status.



Year 6

This week, we have been writing complaint letters and setting descriptions in our English lessons. The children really enjoyed creating these and they were fantastic to read. In history, we began looking at crime and punishment through different periods of time. In science, we created circuits for our electricity topic.

EVERY SCHOOL DAY MATTERS



Penalty Notice Fines for absence from school are changing

From 19th August 2024 Penalty Notice fines increase to £160 for each parent, for each child.











You can be fined if your child has a total of 5 days of unauthorised absences in 10 school weeks, for things like:

- being late after the register has closed
- truancy
- taking a holiday without permission from the school
- or if a headteacher isn't satisfied for the reason for missing school

Over a rolling 3-year period the sanctions are:

- 1st offence £160 reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days
- 2nd offence £160
- 3rd offence Court hearing and up to £2,500 fine, or up to 3 months in prison and a criminal record
