#### **EARLY YEARS**

#### Nursery

This week, we have been exploring the story of What The Ladybird Heard. We have been inspired to learn new things about minibeasts, especially ladybirds. We have used this to help us with our subitising for maths. Subitising is the ability to look at a small set of objects and instantly know how many there are without counting them - this is an important part of early development to support number sense.



#### Reception

This week, we have been continuing our theme of Growth and Change. We read The Very Hungry Caterpillar. The children have produced some amazing art work, such as butterfly collages and painted caterpillars. In maths, we have counted to and from using ten frames and compared numbers. In music, we listened to some great music, you can't beat some, Ain't No Mountain High Enough, sung by Marvin Gaye and Tammi Terrell. A very full on busy week.



#### **KEY STAGE 1**

#### Year 1

Year 1 have thoroughly enjoyed exploring art in the style of Eric Carle. They explored ways in which Eric Carle has used colour, tone, pattern and texture to illustrate parts of a butterfly. The children took inspiration from his work by re-creating a symmetrical butterfly.



#### Year 2

In English this week we started a new genre of writing -

persuasion. We enjoyed practising our persuasion skills verbally and have begun planning our writing.
In computing we have enjoyed reading and creating pictograms using the chromebooks.



#### **LOWER KEY STAGE 2**

#### Year 3

This week, we have been exploring world biomes. A biome is a natural area of plants and animals. The world is divided into many different biomes and they all vary depending on their climate. In addition to their investigation, the children will be creating a model of a specific biome.



#### Year 4

We have been continuing our learning of adding and subtracting fractions. We have been drawing pictorial diagrams to represent our work and have challenged ourselves with reasoning questions. We are looking forward to seeing parents at our Easter production next week.





#### **UPPER KEY STAGE 2**

#### Year 5

This week, we have been focusing on poetry writing. We explored the key features of poetry and used them to write our own poems about different landscapes. In maths, we have been learning how to round decimal numbers to the nearest whole number, tenths, and thousandths.





#### Year 6

This week, we have been finding percentages of amounts in

maths. We have also been recapping some skills so we are ready for SATs in Maythis week we were looking at reflection. In English, we deconstructed a narrative and looked at the features that are required and why they are needed. In geography, we investigated the river Nile and included the effects on



the environment and the landscape.

In science, we looked at how we can see objects.

# Penalty Notice Fines for absence from school are changing

From 19th August 2024 Penalty Notice fines increase to £160 for each parent, for each child.











You can be fined if your child has a total of 5 days of unauthorised absences in 10 school weeks, for things like:

- being late after the register has closed
- truancy
- taking a holiday without permission from the school
- or if a headteacher isn't satisfied for the reason for missing school

Over a rolling 3-year period the sanctions are:

- 1st offence £160 reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days
- 2nd offence £160
- 3rd offence Court hearing and up to £2,500 fine, or up to 3 months in prison and a criminal record


