We would like to thank all parents and carers for supporting their children with costumes and continuing to support with sharing and encouraging positive reading behaviours to make our children 'Readers for Life'.









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COVID UPDATE

We are aware that the Government has revised the guidelines for the use of PPE however, we are governed by Central Bedfordshire Council who has requested that face coverings still be worn when visiting schools. A copy of the most recent update is on our website under the COVID tab.

To summarise the key points, Central Bedfordshire Council requests the following:

- families/young people to wash hands regularly, keep spaces well ventilated, and to wear face masks in crowded, public, indoor areas.
- Face masks should continue to be worn in communal areas and on school and public transport to and from education settings.

CURRICULUM INFORMATION

Following World Book Day, and aiming to maximise the enthusiasm for reading we hope it created, we have developed our own 'Reading Spines'. This is a core of books that create a living library inside our children's minds.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

How to apply for free school meals

If you think you meet the free school meals eligibility criteria, please call the Local Authority on **0300 300 8306**. When you call to apply for free school meals, please have the following information ready:

- National Insurance numbers and dates of birth for you and your partner
- · Dates of birth for your children
- If you receive support from the National Asylum Support Service, your NASS number

If your application is successful, please contact the school office to confirm this to enable us to update our records to reflect this.

Friday 18 March 2022


For a suggestion of a shiny coin (such as a 50p or £1) your child(ren) can wear something red or something colourful should you not have anything red.



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Happy children and happy adults!

Discussing life plans and ambitions with your child can be fun. You can open their minds to endless possibilities and opportunities; the world is their oyster and they can reach for the stars! Whether they want to be an astronaut, doctor, TV journalist, or teacher... what you do with your child now can really help them on the first steps of this journey.

Research has shown that if your child is absent for just seventeen days a year this could mean they are far less likely to be able to read or write when they leave primary or lower school. If your child's annual attendance is 85%, they have missed 29 days schooling, which approximately is half a term. Similar statistics relate to arriving to school late; arriving at school regularly 15



There are 175 non school days a year ...all this time for shopping, holidays and appointments

Getting your child into a good routine now will help them later.

Be prepared - Make sure the uniform and bag is ready. Tiredness - Make sure your child goes to bed at a sensible time.

Set an alarm - Be up and out of bed on time.

Food - Eat a good breakfast.

Time - Talk to your child about what they have been doing at school. Illness - Avoid illnesses by teaching your child to use a tissue and wash their hands.
