
#### **LOWER KEY STAGE 2**

#### <u>Year 4</u>

We have had a very busy week. We wrote persuasive leaflets

about visiting the Alps, which completed our geography unit about the Alpine region. We performed our Easter production to our parents and carers. We are so proud of all the children who learnt their lines and sang beautifully. It takes great courage to narrate and sing a solo in front of an audience - everyone did a brilliant job!



#### **UPPER KEY STAGE 2**

#### Year 5

We have had an exciting week learning about igloos in our

DT lesson. This has been linked to our geography topic 'Frozen Kingdoms'. The children then designed, made and evaluated an igloo style shelter using milk cartons and card. The objective was to make a small model igloo that could keep strong in a cold climate and be sturdy enough to support an entrance/doorway. The children really enjoyed being creative and

using their design skills. We also wrote poems in English lessons where the chil-



dren used features such as metaphors, rhyme and onomatopoeia.

#### <u>Year 6</u>

In maths, we have been finding the area and perimeter of shapes. We have learnt that compound shapes are shapes that are made from two or more shapes put together. In English, we wrote a narrative which included dialogue. In science, we learnt about refraction and whether different objects would refract or reflect light.



#### **Reception**

This week, we have enjoyed learning about the story Titch. By looking at the characters and setting of the story. In maths, we have been learning doubles. By using dominoes and numicon, we found doubles to calculate the total. We have learnt that Christians celebrate Easter with different traditions such as Easter egg hunts, giving Easter eggs and cards to friends and family.

#### What Is a PTA?

# EVERY SCHOOL DAY MATTERS

## Penalty Notice Fines for absence from school are changing

From 19<sup>th</sup> August 2024 Penalty Notice fines increase to £160 for each parent, for each child.



You can be fined if your child has a total of 5 days of unauthorised absences in 10 school weeks, for things like:

- being late after the register has closed
- truancy
- taking a holiday without permission from the school
- or if a headteacher isn't satisfied for the reason for missing school

Over a rolling 3-year period the sanctions are:

- 1st offence £160 reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days
- 2nd offence £160
- 3rd offence Court hearing and up to £2,500 fine, or up to 3 months in prison and a criminal record
