EARLY YEARS

Nursery

We are kick starting the new term by focusing on all things water, using our focus book 'Splish, Splash, Splosh' as inspiration we have been learning about how important water is in our world. This week in Platinum Jubilee the children have been creating bubble artwork. Bubble painting is a fun and engaging activity that allows children to explore colour and create unique artwork. It involves mixing paint and bubble solution, the children then gently blow bubbles with a straw and this creates prints on the paper.







Welcome back! Our new theme is Explore and Discover. After

reading the story 'Sam who went to Sea', we made our own vehicles and sorted them into categories of land and sea. This week we have attended three assemblies with years 1 and 2 and have played on the big playground. We are focusing on daily writing after phonics and we have changed our reading books independently. We are really proud of how well the children have matured.



KEY STAGE 1

Year 1

This week, we engaged with an old toys workshop with our parents! It was lovely to see the children interact with both old and new toys through play. There were lots of fantastic discussions and conclusions to determine whether the toys were old or new.







Year 2

Reception

In English this week, we have been looking at the features of an instructional text, such as imperative verbs, lists of equipment and sequenced, chronological steps. We followed some instructions to make a witch's spell, but we were a bit disappointed that the spell didn't clean our classroom like it was meant to!

LOWER KEY STAGE 2

Year 3

We were introduced to the inspirational story of Malala Yousafzai this week. After listening to her journey and discussing her various accomplishments, the children created a time-line of her journey. We also discussed her quote -"Let us remember: One child, one teacher, one pen and one book can change the world."





Year 4

This week, we began exploring our new class reader, 'The Last Bear'. As part of their English work, the children have been learning to identify and understand the differences between the head voice, speaking voice, and heart voice, which helps them connect more deeply with the characters and themes in the story. In maths, the children have been putting all their hard work and practice to the test by completing the Multiplication Tables Check (MTC). We are proud of their effort and focus!







UPPER KEY STAGE 2

Year 5

This week the children have been discussing newspaper reports in English and have started to read the book 'Running Wild' by Michael Morpurgo. They will be discussing the topic of tsunamis linked to the geography unit 'Extreme Earth' and creating their own newspaper report. In maths, the children continued to identify angle types and use protractors. They have measured angles in degrees and used a protractor to draw angles and shapes.

Year 6

We started our week off by taking part in the Knex Challenge, where we were tasked to create a fair ground ride out of Knex.

We came up with many creative designs and all worked collaboratively with our

partners. In English, we have been writing character descriptions and in Science we've been using the symbols for circuits when drawing our own complete circuits.

Penalty Notice Fines for absence from school are changing

From 19th August 2024 Penalty Notice fines increase to £160 for each parent, for each child.











You can be fined if your child has a total of 5 days of unauthorised absences in 10 school weeks, for things like:

- being late after the register has closed
- truancy
- taking a holiday without permission from the school
- or if a headteacher isn't satisfied for the reason for missing school

Over a rolling 3-year period the sanctions are:

- 1st offence £160 reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days
- 2nd offence £160
- 3rd offence Court hearing and up to £2,500 fine, or up to 3 months in prison and a criminal record
