Dear Parents, Carers and Children,

Welcome back to Autumn 2, often a favourite with the children and staff due to the many upcoming religious festivals and celebrations. I am looking forward to hearing carols being practised as I walk through the school corridor! We started the week with a training session for all staff on our new approach towards behaviour called Therapeutic Thinking. We have introduced our behaviour motto of 'ready, respectful and safe' and are reminding children of the behaviour expectations at all times. Staff had further training delivered by external providers around Safeguarding and De-escalation strategies. Our lockdown policy and procedures have been reviewed and we will be carrying out a lockdown drill in the upcoming weeks. We will be talking this procedure through with all children and explaining the reasons behind why a lockdown may need to take place. If you have any questions around this, please do not hesitate to speak to your child's class teacher.

The first week back has already been filled with many events:

- -a residential trip for our year 6 children—we are certainly looking forward to welcoming them back and hearing about their great experiences. Thank you to the staff who accompanied the children on their trip.
- -a Macmillan coffee morning with representatives from the nursing team who shared information about mental health services available for all—thank you to all parents and carers for attending and thank you for your contributions
- -a fun-filled and engaging visit from the author, Emily Lloyd-Gale who shared the stories she has written and the process behind this. The children were enthusiastic and inspired by her journey. Emily will be on the playground after school selling copies of her books and will accept payments by card or cash.

# Penalty Notice Fines for absence from school are changing

From 19th August 2024 Penalty Notice fines increase to £160 for each parent, for each child.











You can be fined if your child has a total of 5 days of unauthorised absences in 10 school weeks, for things like:

- being late after the register has closed
- truancy
- taking a holiday without permission from the school
- or if a headteacher isn't satisfied for the reason for missing school

Over a rolling 3-year period the sanctions are:

- 1st offence £160 reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days
- 2nd offence £160
- 3rd offence Court hearing and up to £2,500 fine, or up to 3 months in prison and a criminal record
