<u>Topics to be covered this term include:</u> Using adjectives and expanded noun phrases to write descriptive texts. Using sub-headings to organise information in non-fiction texts. Using conjunctions, such as 'but' and 'because' to explain and give reasons during information and Scientific writing.

<u>Grammar:</u> nouns, verbs, adjectives, expanded noun phrases, conjunctions, apostrophes for contractions, types of sentence-statement, command, question, exclamation Spelling: plurals, suffixes, compound words, homophones.

Maths



Our learning will cover work on:

Addition & Subtraction- number facts to 10, 20 and pairs of multiples of 10 that make 100. Adding & subtracting a single number to/ from a 2-digit numbers using fingers. Adding 3 single digit numbers together. Beginning to use a number line to add and subtract two 2-digit numbers. Place Value- tens and units, partitioning numbers, saying 10 more/ less than any 2-digit number.

How you can help - times tables (10x, 2x, 5x), number facts etc. Using money to combine amounts and give change, telling the time (o'clock, half past, quarter past, quarter to, 5 minute intervals).

Topic work - topics this term will include:

Grace Darling (History- Who was Grace Darling? Why was she famous? Developing knowledge of Britain in the past). Lighthouses (Design & Technology project- design, plan, make and evaluate a model, Literacy-The Lighthouse Keeper stories). The Seaside (History- How the British seaside holiday began in Victorian times, Science- exploring life at the seashore, rockpools, classifying creatures, food chains, life cycles. Geography- Where are seaside resorts, vocabulary of physical geography for the seaside). Australia (Geography- how is Australia different to the UK? Science- Classifying wildlife, animals & babies, habitats). Planning a Pirate Party (Science- healthy eating, Design & Technology- Food technology, planning a party, English- types of writing, invitations, menus etc. Humanities- pirates in the past).

The children will also have weekly RE, PSHE, Values, Music and Spanish sessions.

Homework

Your child will need to read their reading book daily at home. Your child will also have a weekly tables test. Please help them chant them as well as answering and recording the answers to randomly chosen facts. Your child will have a homework book for weekly Literacy and Numeracy or longer topic based project work.
