Communication and Language





We will continue to develop the children's communication and language skills through speaking and listening activities, such as circle time. Through daily Letters and Sounds sessions we will be further developing listening skills and also focus on rhyme, alliteration and oral blending and segmenting. These activities are the foundations for early reading and writing skills. We will also begin to introduce letters alongside these activities.

We will enjoy a variety of stories, encouraging the children to retell the main events and think about what might happen next. How you can help -Please continue to share your child's reading book daily, share lots of stories, ask them to retell stories in their own words, talk about the pictures and what might happen next.
